The project

DATA CELLAR is an innovation action funded by the EU under the Horizon Europe Programme. It runs from June 2022 to November 2025. The project aims to create a federated energy dataspace that will support the creation, development and management of Local Energy Communities (LECs) in the EU. The developed data space will provide Local Energy Communities (LEC) stakeholders with data, services and tools to enhance their current and develop new operations and aims to be interoperable with other EU energy data spaces. The lawful grounds for the processing

How long do we keep your personal data?

How do we store your personal data?

The record of your participation, your name, and your contact information will be kept in a file separate from the research data. All data will be stored on password-protected computers, in secure locations at DATA CELLAR partner institutions, and shared through a secure online platform managed by RINA-C.

Sharing your personal data

We will share your personal data with third parties where required by law, where it is necessary to administer our relationship with you or where we have another relevant, carefully assessed legitimate interest in doing so. We will not disclose your personal data to third parties unless there is a legal basis for this. We will not share your personal data for marketing purposes. All information we collect about you will be kept strictly confidential unless we are required to share your information with the European Commission as part of our obligations. Unless you directly consent, we will not publish any information in reports or communications materials that would enable you to be directly or indirectly identified. However, the researcher has a duty of care to report to the relevant authorities possible harm/danger to the participant or others. If this were the case, we would inform you of any decisions that might limit your confidentiality.



Your rights

You have the right to information regarding what is collected and processed, to access your data being processed, to delete or make any changes to this information, and to restrict processing. You have the right to receive requested information in a time-limited fashion.
